Members started arriving at 9.30 at our designated meeting place.....All Souls Chapel at Rookwood for a 10.00 commencement.



We learnt that the cemetery has been operating since 1867 and received its name from the number of crows (rooks) in the area.





We also learnt that it had its own railway station used for receiving its permanent guests from Sydney. Cost was 1 shilling return but for permanents the trip was free! Due to the rise of the motor vehicle, in 1948, the 'Mortuary' station as it was known, ceased to operate.

Some famous residents...Anthony Hordern, John Fairfax, Roy 'Mo' Rene, Captain Moonlite and also Jack Bradshaw, the last of the bushrangers, to name just a few.

The tour, both on foot and by car, lasted approximately 2 hours with the group debunking to the Carnarvon golf club for lunch.

A pleasant, enjoyable day was had by all but we hardly scratched the surface!
