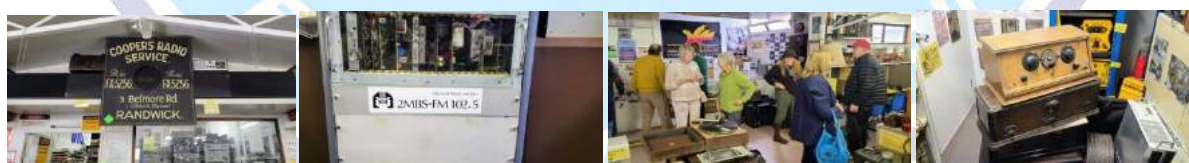
However all were present and accounted for at the designated times and the show kicked off without a hitch!

The exhibits include hundreds of domestic, armed service, professional and commercial radios along with studio and transmission equipment. The history of radio through the decades, with particular relevance to the Australian scene, is traced via the many articles on display. You could send morse code if you so desired, check out a radio control room, listen to a tape recorder that cost more than a car, browse the AWA room etc....a wonderful experience indeed!
